- Which of the following functions are eigen functions of $\frac{d^2}{dx^2}$? What are their eigen values ?

- Indicate which of the following functions are acceptable as wave functions :

(a) $\psi = x$.	(b) $\psi = \sin x$.
(c) $\psi = e^{-x}$	(d) $\psi = e^{-x}$
- Show that $[x, \hat{p}_x] = \frac{1}{2\pi i} nx^n$.
- Explain the condition for orthogonality of a wave function.
- The size of the nucleus is 10^{-12} cm. Treating it as a one-dimensional box, show why electron does not exist in the nucleus.
- Write the Schrödinger equation and Hamiltonian for a particle on a sphere in spherical polar co-ordinates.
- Define spin orbital. Write one example.
- Obtain an approximate wave function for He atom.
- Explain, what is meant by normalisation.
- Set up the Huckel determinant for ethylene and get the energies allowed for the pi-electrons.

12. Determine the ground-state molecular term symbols of O_2 and O_2^+ .
13. Plot the radial nodes of 4s, 4p, 4d and 4f hydrogen like wave functions.
14. The wave function of H is given $\psi = \frac{1}{\sqrt{\pi}} \left(\frac{1}{a_0} \right)^{3/2} e^{-r/a_0}$. Where do you find maximum electron density. Justify your answer.

15. Using $\psi = Nx(a - x)$ as the trial function, obtain an expression for ground state energy of electron.
16. Develop the trial function used for the MO treatment of H_2 . Write down the expression for the MOs and energies obtained from this trial function. Show the MO diagram of this molecule. What is the Multiplicity of the ground state of this molecule?
17. Set up the Schrödinger wave equation for a particle in a three dimensional rectangular box.
18. What is Slater determinant? Write the Slater determinants for Helium atom ground state ($1s^2$) and the excited state ($1s^1 2s^1$).
19. Write equation for L^2 and L_z , in terms of spherical polar co-ordinates.
20. Compare the Cartesian and Spherical Polar Co-ordinates.
21. Apply the Schrödinger equation for a simple Harmonic Oscillator. Transform into Hermite equation.
22. Apply HMO method for butadiene. Find the energy of π molecular orbitals.
23. Discuss the bonding in H_2^+ ion according to MO theory.
24. Draw the energy level diagram of N_2 molecule. Explain with reasons whether N_2 molecule is paramagnetic or diamagnetic.
